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What We Believe

On the Child

Every child is born with a unique combination of gifts, curiosity, and potential that no examination result can fully measure and no single educator can fully exhaust. Education, rightly understood, does not deposit knowledge into a child. It draws out what is already there — and builds what is not yet there — with patience, intelligence, and love.
